You might find yourself wondering how much this decision will matter in the long run and whether choosing the right high school will shape your child’s future in ways you can’t yet see.

You may feel excited for what’s ahead, while at the same time wishing you could hold on just a little longer to what is familiar, known, and comfortable.

And underneath it all, there can be that quiet question: *What’s next?*

What will these years look like for my child? Will they find their place? Will they grow into who God is calling them to be?

We understand that tension. We’ve walked with many families who have stood right where you are now.

Welcome to our discipleship focused high school.

This is something new for your child, and for you. It’s new people, new challenges, and a new way of learning. It’s a lot of new, but it’s *new with purpose.*

We want to walk alongside your family as you prepare your child to follow the Lord wherever He calls. We are committed to helping them discover their gifts and talents, to challenging them toward excellence, and to creating an environment where they can grow and thrive spiritually, academically, and socially.

Our desire is that, over these years, you will see your child gain confidence, deepen their faith, and step into the person God has created them to be.

Here are our commitments to you as parents:

1. Our high school will be a Christian endeavour that is fiercely committed to sharing the Gospel with our students.
2. We are committed to maintaining an extremely high level of excellence in all educational programming.
3. We are fully accredited with the Ministry of Education and offer our students an Ontario Secondary School Diploma and access to all post-secondary options.

high school, reimagined

We have designed our model with a clear purpose: to prepare students for life after high school, while creating space for strong, meaningful relationships with their teachers.

As a parent, you may be wondering what this kind of learning really looks like and whether your child will have the structure, support, and guidance they need to succeed. It's a fair question. Our blend of teacher led and self directed time can sound like a lot of responsibility for a teenager. But at its core, this model is not about leaving students on their own - most of the week is spent in teacher-led classes. This is where new concepts are taught, questions are worked through, and students are guided step by step in their learning. Alongside this, students are given scheduled self-directed blocks throughout the week.

Each morning, your child will begin the day by connecting with their small group for a time of Bible study, prayer, and accountability. This daily rhythm helps ground students before they step into their learning and creates a consistent space where they are known and supported.

This time also serves as a practical starting point for the day. Students receive important updates, hear from their teachers, and are given the direction they need for their coursework. From there, students will create a plan for their scheduled self-directed blocks and review it with a Teacher Advisor before getting started. With guidance and support, they learn how to set priorities, manage their time well, and take meaningful ownership of their learning.

Within an SD period, students essentially are in charge of their time, but they are not alone:

hello, **Teacher Advisors**.

so, what are Teacher Advisors?

Each day begins with a 40-minute Teacher Advisory (T.A.) led class, which is central to our discipleship model. We begin in God's Word and create space for meaningful connection with peers, helping students start their day grounded and focused.

T.A. classes include students from Grades 9 through 12, giving younger students the opportunity to be encouraged and mentored, while older students grow in confidence and leadership as they support those coming behind them. Students pray together, share life experiences, and build relationships that help them navigate their high school years with wisdom and support.

This time is also an important academic checkpoint. Students work with their Teacher Advisor to assess their progress, identify any areas of concern, and set clear goals for the days ahead. Because T.A. teachers stay closely connected to course instructors and grade books, they are able to monitor grades, track

completed work, and help students stay on top of assignments while developing strong time-management habits.

Just as importantly, T.A. creates space for teachers to truly know each student. Our staff wants to understand what makes your child tick - which NHL team they're cheering for, or who their favourite author is. Getting to know students as people, not just as learners, is a meaningful part of who we are as a school.

As Paul instructed the church in Corinth, our T.A. invitation is clear: 'Follow me as I follow Christ...'

discipleship. because this world is not our home

When you hear the word *discipleship*, you might immediately think of Bible classes, Scripture memory, or growing in faith. And while those things are deeply important to us, discipleship at STCCS is much more than that.

It means your child is not just another student moving through a system, but a person who is understood, supported, and guided with intention. It means we take the time to truly know who they are. We learn what excites them, what discourages them, and where they feel most confident.

We pay attention to how they learn best, where they struggle, and what they need in order to succeed.

Because of this, we are able to walk alongside each student in a meaningful way. We know when a student needs to be challenged, and when they need support. We know when something needs to be adjusted in their schedule so that everything else can work well. We notice when they are falling behind, and we step in early. We also recognize their growth and encourage them to keep going.

Discipleship also means relationship.

Our students are known not just by one teacher, but by our entire staff. With a smaller student body, every student has multiple staff who are “their person”- invested in them. This creates a community where students feel safe, supported, and seen. It is not uncommon for students to open up about what is going on in their lives, because those relationships have been built on trust, consistency, and care.

And yes, discipleship also means pointing students to Christ. We open God’s Word together. We pray together. We encourage students to grow in their faith and to understand who they are in Him.

But we believe discipleship is not just something that happens in a Bible lesson. It is woven into every conversation, every class, and every moment of the day.

why is self directed time important?



Our self-directed blocks are designed to support discipleship and prepare students for life after high school.

Self-directed time creates something that is often hard to find in a traditional schedule: space. Space for a teacher to sit down with a student, talk through a challenge, ask good questions, and really listen. Without the pressure of moving through a lesson, these are often the moments where trust is built and students feel most known and supported. This is where the relationship piece of discipleship has room to grow.

It also helps students develop the soft skills they will rely on after graduation. Both students who are excelling and those who need extra support benefit from the structure and flexibility of a model that blends teacher-led instruction with self-directed learning.

For high achieving students, self-directed time removes the ceiling. They are not held to the pace of their peers. They have the freedom to move ahead, set ambitious goals, and push themselves further. It creates space for growth, challenge, and ownership at a level that matches their ability.

For students who find school more difficult, self-directed time is not a disadvantage. In many ways, it is exactly what they need. If a student struggles with focus, time management, or completing work on time, the goal is not to avoid those challenges, but to address them. High school is the place to build those habits, not after graduation when the stakes are higher and the support is lower.

Within our model, students are never left on their own. They are guided, supported, and held accountable. They learn how to plan their time, make wise decisions, and follow through on their responsibilities, all with the consistent presence of our teaching staff, who know them well.

Our blend of teacher led instruction and self directed time doesn't just serve one style of learning. It serves all students and prepares them for what comes next.

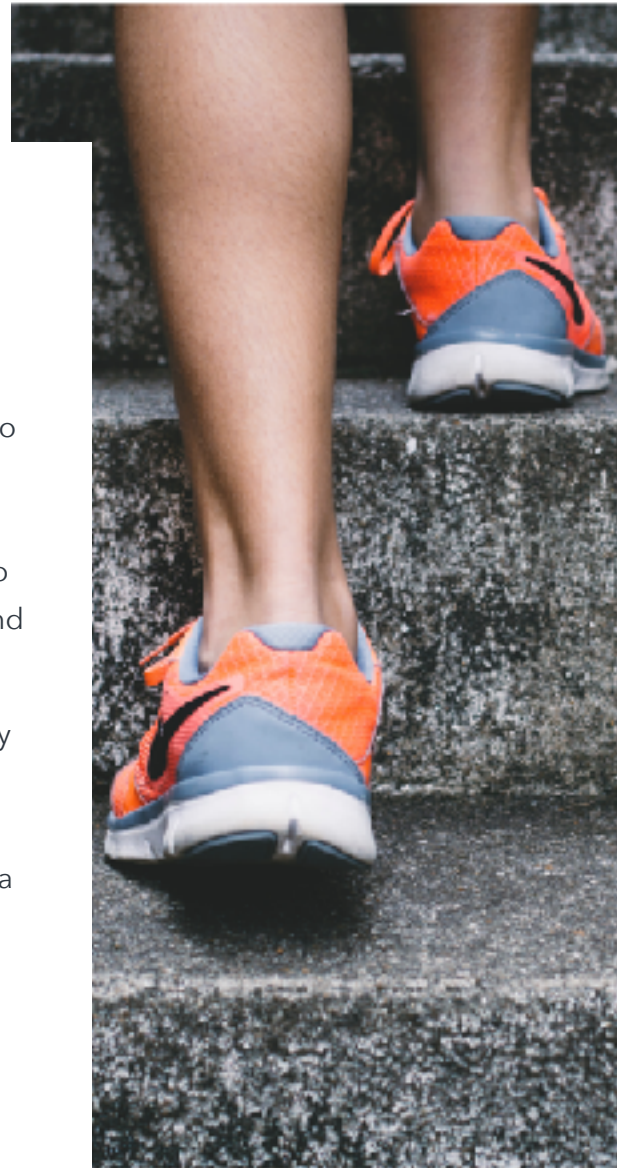
talk about extra*
